Nursing students can apply for admission to the BSN–MPH program by February of Year One in the nursing program. The first-year nursing curriculum is unchanged for students in the BSN–MPH program, with the option to take an MPH elective during the Year One summer. In Year Two of the program, students begin adding course work in the MPH program; students formally apply for admission to the MPH program by March 1 of Year Two. Students graduate in May of Year Two with the BS–Nursing degree, and then finish the MPH during the Year Two Summer through the Year Three summer. Courses in blue font meet requirements for the Master of Public Health Degree.
