DIRECT PATHWAY TO A FACULTY POSITION

Postdoctoral traineeships may extend from one to three years. These positions are intended to provide a pathway for qualified, productive, and successful postdoctoral trainees to enter a tenure-track faculty position at the School of Nursing.

REQUIREMENTS

- Recent (within two years) PhD or equivalent in nursing or closely related field
- A firm commitment to a research-intensive nursing faculty career
- Eligibility for licensure as a registered nurse (RN) in Wisconsin

TO APPLY

Required application materials:

- Cover letter describing interest in postdoctoral traineeship at UW-Madison School of Nursing
- Curriculum vitae (CV)
- One databased paper (preferably published)
- Three letters of reference
- Research and training needs statement
